Background and Webinar Objectives

- Home-based primary care is important for addressing health needs and advancing health equity, particularly for older adults and those with complex health and social needs who struggle to access care in traditional clinical settings. Yet there remains unmet demand for home-based primary care, which is exacerbated in rural areas with rural adults [78 percent less likely](#) than those in the largest metropolitan counties to receive home-based medical care.
- This webinar will discuss the unique challenges of supporting rural home-based primary care and evidence-based policy and reforms to scale home-based primary care in rural areas to enhance equitable access to comprehensive, longitudinal care.
